

## **“Colourful Sails of Pyramids” - Autobiography of Robin Drinkall**

### **Overview**

A Parallel Universe? Is it remotely possible that the terrorist attacks in New York of 2001 triggered a response from a parallel universe? The result of which lead US law enforcement towards the masterminds behind the attack? The autobiography “Colourful Sails of Pyramids” provides a unique and exclusive insight into a parallel life where impressions have been formed and stored as memories during the first 36 years of life. The accumulation of these memories reached a peak shortly after the new Millennium and led to a series of actions that prevented a further attack on America.

Robin was born on 31 January 1965 and lived the first 10 years of his life in the rural Lancashire village of Preesall. He entered secondary school in Preston before college and University in Leicester. At the age of 22yrs he received a regional award for his entrepreneurship followed by other national awards before reaching 26yrs of age. In 1995 he moved to Copenhagen in Denmark with his Danish wife and after working a number of years at the United Nations Development Programme he set up a new company in the year 2000 at Denmark’s leading Technological Institute. The new IT company succeeded in winnings contracts with some of the worlds largest pharmaceutical companies for digitally capturing data from patients using their medicines. The start-up in Denmark and experiences are relived in the book as well as establishing a second start-up company in Cambridge, UK.

The autobiography of Robin Drinkall retells the unique entrepreneurial story in Cambridge, UK between 2003 and 2004 in clear detail and how a rogue agent of MI6 was discovered during the process. The book details the psychology of entrepreneurship and the resolve to achieve goals during the business process from a life which seems to be a blend of Robert Ludlum’s “Holcroft Covenant” and Dan Brown’s “Da Vinci Code” the only difference being the autobiography is true. The contact with the rogue MI6 agent also reveals how the agent’s personality changed during the 14 months between January 2003 and March 2004. The changes in his personality were minuscule but alarming and yet had huge implications for the British State. The rogue MI6 agent becomes central to the autobiography and yet there is also something more intriguing recounted through the entrepreneurs childhood reflections that keeps the reader curious and intrigued but more focused on the prominent story line.

The entrepreneurial spirit which is key to the success and survival during the Cambridge start-up project is demonstrated through insights into thought processes and decisions that were taken to reduce risk. The overall success of the Cambridge project was thus measured by the need for endurance, survival, intuitive thinking and Self Actualisation. However, during the 14 months of entrepreneurial activity various reflections of childhood memories created moments of curiosity and wonderment in trying to determine if the rogue MI6 agent had prior knowledge of the entrepreneur from more than 35 years earlier and if so for what purpose?

The climax of the Cambridge start-up project ends with Cambridgeshire Police and issues of National Security suppressing free talk over the crimes linked to the MI6 agent. The entrepreneur thereafter quickly returns to Denmark to develop the Danish company and within 8 months starts to receive letters of support from the Prime Ministers of UK, Denmark, Australia and New Zealand and President George W. Bush as well as other known leaders including Baroness Thatcher.

Fast entrepreneurial actions, observation and steadfast resolve secured his story for future generations of entrepreneurs. Colourful Sails of Pyramids is the story.
